

HARDENBERGIA COMPTONIANA

This climbing plant has purple pea flowers and its common name is Native Wistaria. The generic name commemorates the Countess von Hardenberg, a sister of Baron von Huegel, who in 1833 was the first botanist to visit the Swan River district after settlement.

KENNEDIA COCCINEA

A member of the pea family, this climbing plant has beautiful red flowers and is found on coastal limestone and also on the Darling Scarp and Range.

TEMPLETONIA RETUSA

Mandurah's floral emblem and once common in the area, the Templetonia is named for John Templeton, an Irish patron of horticulture. Its winter flowering habit provides food for birds when other nectar is scarce.

SOWERBAEA LAXIFLORA

This perennial herb belongs to the lily family and its common name, Purple Tassels, describes the pretty purple flowers which have bright yellow anthers.

HOVEA PUNGENS

A small shrub with vivid purple pea flowers which have white to yellow centres. The leaves are prickly and dark green and its common name is Devils Pins.

HIBBERTIA HYPERICOIDES

A very well recognised low growing plant which has bright yellow flowers over a long period. Its common name is Native Buttercup.

BANKSIA LITTORALIS

This Banksia has pale yellow flower spikes held erect among the dark green serrated leaves, the undersides of which are white. The flowers are succeeded by woody fruiting cones with prominent follicles, each containing two seeds.

MELALEUCA HUEGELII

A large shrub with attractive foliage but better known for its flowers: the buds are deep pink and become pale pink or white on opening.

ANIGOZANTHOS HUMILIS

The Catspaw grows in clumps and the flowers are invested with a woolly covering varying from yellow to red through an intense orange. The specific name 'humilis' refers to the low stature of the plant.

GREVILLEA CRITHMIFOLIA

Compact, branching shrub. White, sometimes pink-tinged flowers July-September. A quick-growing prostrate form is often used as a groundcover in gardens.
